The Nicene Creed, Part 2

Last month, we looked at the Council of Nicaea, held in 325, called by the Roman emperor Constantine in response to the heresy of the preaching of Arius regarding Jesus' divinity. It was at this Council that did formulate the first formulation of the Creed, in which concluded that Jesus was fully human and fully divine and was of the same substance of God the Father.

This month, we will focus on the First Council of Constantinople which was called in part to confirm the Faith of the Nicaean Council and to continue to dispute Arianism. The Council of Constantinople (present day Istanbul, Turkey), was called in May 381 by Emperor Theodosius to provide for a <u>Catholic</u> succession in the patriarchal <u>See of Constantinople</u>, to confirm the Nicene Faith/ Creed, to reconcile the <u>semi-Arians</u> with the <u>Church</u>, and to put an end to the Macedonian <u>heresy</u>, which denied the full person and divinity of the Holy Spirit.

Originally it was only a council of the Orient and was attended by 150 <u>Catholic</u> and 36 <u>heretical</u> (<u>Semi-Arian</u>, Macedonian) <u>bishops</u>, and was presided over by <u>Meletius of Antioch</u>; after his death, by the successive Patriarchs of Constantinople, <u>St. Gregory Nazianzen</u> and Nectarius.

The Council drew up a formal treatise on the <u>Catholic doctrine</u> of the Trinity. This is traditionally held to be an enlargement of the <u>Nicene Creed</u>, with emphasis on the Divinity of the Holy Spirit. It seems, however, to be of earlier origin, and was probably composed (369-73) by <u>St. Cyril of Jerusa-</u><u>lem</u> as an expression of the <u>faith</u> of that Church , though its adoption by this council gave it special authority, both as a <u>baptismal</u> creed and as a <u>theological</u> formula.

At the close of this council <u>Emperor Theodosius</u> issued an imperial <u>decree</u> (30 July) declaring that the churches should be restored to those <u>bishops</u> who confessed the equal Divinity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and who held communion with Nectarius of Constantinople and other important Oriental <u>prelates</u> whom he named. Pope Damasus approved it.

Next month, we will begin to look at the Nicene Creed in detail, focusing on the first of the of the Statements of Faith: I Believe in One God....



Thanks to all who came out and showed out at our annual Halloween event. A great time was had by all and couldn't have been possible without everyone's participation!


We are looking forward to our 5th graders serving at our Youth Mass on November 19 at 11:00.
