

Mission Statement



Lenten Parish Mission

with Fr. Steve Bruno, Pastor of St. Rita's in Harahan, LA

March 4-6, 2024



Fr. Steven Bruno Bio

I was born and raised in Mid-City New Orleans, serving at the Altar of God at St. Anthony of Padua until I was a senior in High School at St. John Prep, a 'minor seminary' run by the Archdiocese of New Orleans. My college career was very non-traditional until I finally graduated from Our Lady of Holy Cross College. After several years working at a family-owned reprographic company, I discerned a call to enter seminary. I entered a formation year at Notre Dame Seminary with another 'late vocation' who had been at NDS for a year, now Fr. John Hourican. We were ordained on the same day, June 4, 2005, so we unfortunately could not attend each other's ordination. I served at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish for a couple of years before being asked to work in the Vocations Office at the chancery, where I served for the next 7 years. Needing to get back to parish life, I served at St. Philip Neri Parish for a couple of years before being asked to become a Pastor for the first time at St. Rita of Cascia in Harahan, a small incorporated city just west of New Orleans proper. I have served there for the last 7 years and hope to be there for the next 5 years to finish repairs from Hurricane Ida and complete a Capital Campaign to refresh our 60 year old church.

I've just recently (Dec 2021) become a cat owner (getting Marcus from a local shelter), and last year I felt had to get him a buddy, one-eyed Jack. I love music and played guitar for much of my life. Now I just play silly songs for the school children (we have 328 children in our parochial school). I truly look forward to coming up to Memphis to lead a Mission that hopefully will invigorate and inspire faith for all those who attend. I will use some music, some slides to guide the presentation, and some video clips to keep our attention, which seems to be decreasing as we trudge through a society insisting on 140 characters in a tweet to inform us about even very complex issues. Please join me March 4th, 5th, and 6th, to help make our Lenten journey fruitful and spiritual.

Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

Catholics should make spiritual preparation before receiving Holy Communion. We do this by abstaining from food and drink (except water and medicine) for at least one hour before receiving Communion (see Can. 919: §1). Be aware that chewing gum breaks the Eucharistic fast. No one should ever attempt to receive Communion with chewing gum in their mouth. Also, a Catholic in a state of mortal sin should first make a sacramental confession before returning to the Eucharist.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Please have someone contact the Parish Office if you are hospitalized or are seriously ill. Due to privacy laws, hospitals do not notify churches when patients are admitted. Also, Catholics are encouraged to seek the sacrament in advance of scheduled surgery.
